



Frequently Asked Questions:

Election to CSBA's Board of Directors for 2026-2028 term as a Regional Director

How many Regional Directors are there? CSBA consists of 21 geographic regions across the state, as well one statewide region, Region 14, which represents county boards of education. Each region is represented on the Board by a Regional Director In addition, the Board includes 5 Directors-at-Large and 4 Officers.

Are all Regional Directors elected at the same time? No, Regional Directors from odd-numbered regions are elected in odd-numbered years. Regional Directors from even-numbered regions are elected in even-numbered years.

Who can run to become a member of CSBA's Board of Directors? Any board member from a CSBA-member district or county office of education board within the region may be nominated to run for the Board of Directors, however Standing Rule 108 prohibits simultaneous service on state-wide boards that represent the education community such as those that represent labor, parents, special interests, or other areas of the school governance community. Standing Rule 109 also prohibits CSBA employees from serving on the Board of Directors.

Who can nominate the Regional Directors? Regional Directors must be nominated by a Delegate from the region in writing to the President of the Association using the nomination form. Nominations open on August 1 and close on October 2, 2026. A candidate may submit an optional resume that's due by Friday, October 2, 2026.

When and where are the elections held? The elections will take place on Wednesday, December 2, 2026 at CSBA's Delegate Assembly meeting held at the Marriott Marquis San Diego Marina.

How long does a Regional Director serve on the Board? Regional Directors serve two-year terms and take office immediately upon the close of the Association's Annual Education Conference and trade Show. Directors may run for re-election if they choose to, there are no term limits.

When and where are the required meetings for Regional Directors? Regional Directors are required to attend the Board of Directors meetings and the Delegate Assembly Meetings. There are five Board meetings each year held over a weekend, except for the meetings in May and late November/early December, which are held on a single day in conjunction with the Delegate Assembly.. There are two Delegate Assembly meetings scheduled, as noted in May and late November/early December in host city of the Association's Annual Education Conference. The May meeting takes place in Sacramento the day before the Delegate Assembly meeting. In 2027, the November meeting will take place in Sacramento, the day before the Delegate Assembly meeting, followed by the Annual Education Conference. The meeting in late January/early February takes place at a determined offsite location while the meetings in late March/early April and late September/early October typically take place at the CSBA office in West Sacramento.

What do Directors do? *Members of the Board of Directors establish the vision, mission, and goals for the Association, ensure that Association activities and programs remain focused on those goals and the issues identified in the Policy Platform. They provide advocacy on behalf of children, public education, local boards, and the Association; serve on committees, councils, and task forces; and receive reports and updates on major programs consistent with the Vision, Mission, and Strategic Goals of the Association. They also provide two-way communication with Delegate Assembly members and local board members; and support and participate in the Association's activities and events.*

In addition, the Board of Directors have corporate duties to adopt the Association's budget; adopt and amend the Association's Standing Rules; receive reports on corporate operations; approve the hiring and terms of employment of the CEO & Executive Director, upon recommendation of the Executive Committee; comment annually on the performance, and acts on the contract of the CEO & Executive Director, upon recommendation of the Executive Committee; and abide by the Code of Ethics, Conflict of Interest Policy, and Whistleblower Policy, as adopted by the Board of Directors.

Are there campaign rules?

Yes. Candidates for Regional Director are expected to read, understand, and follow the rules laid out in the Board Bylaws and Standing rules, including Standing Rule 226 "Rules for Campaigns for Officers, Regional Directors, and Directors-at-Large," which includes the following:

- Officers, Directors, candidates and prospective candidates shall not disparage through misinformation, gossip, or innuendo any other candidate or prospective candidate.*
- Candidates and prospective candidates shall engage in any campaign in a professional manner, focused on growing and strengthening the organization.*
- Directors and Delegates may provide verbal information, comments, endorsements, opinions, or other influential verbal communications to others regarding candidates or prospective candidates.*
- Directors may not provide written information, comments, endorsements, opinions, or other influential communications regarding candidates or prospective candidates. Written comments include comments that are memorialized on paper or in any electronic format including email, social media platforms, or any other form of written communication.*
- Delegates may provide written information, comments, endorsements, opinions, or other influential communications regarding candidates or prospective candidates.*
- Campaign activities that include any travel outside of the candidate's region to specifically promote their candidacy or obtain endorsements is prohibited.*
- Any reception, meeting, or any other event – other than the CSBA sponsored, no-host reception – that specifically promotes a CSBA candidacy is prohibited.*
- Election gimmicks or other attention getting devices or items, including but not limited to, pins, banners, signs, posters, balloons, hats, or any other antic, item or activity that promotes a candidate or prospective candidate by name, position, or by other means are prohibited.*
- Distribution of written campaign literature that is intended to promote a candidate or candidacy by the prospective candidate, by the candidate, or by anyone acting on behalf of a prospective candidate or candidate must adhere to the rules described in Standing Rule 226.F.5.*
