CDE issues reminder about CAASPP summary results release plan

Recommends LEAs distribute results after CDE releases statewide results

The California Department of Education recently issued a reminder to LEAs about the CDE's release plan for the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress summary results. The CDE plans to publicly release statewide results in mid-to-late August because final results of the Mathematics and English Language Arts/Literacy assessments that were administered as part of the CAASPP system will not be ready until that time. Although some states have already released, or may release, preliminary 2014-15 Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments, the CDE recommends LEAs avoid releasing results until the CDE releases statewide results. "We believe releasing preliminary results would confuse and possibly mislead the public," states the CDE in a July memo to LEA CAASPP coordinators. "Releasing results together will provide members of the public with the context they need to understand this new era of testing," the memo continues. "We plan to update LEAs about our release plans as they become final and look forward to working closely with LEAs." District officials may email the CAASPP office with questions about this topic.

Local press conferences on reserve cap held last week

Inland Empire and Bay Area school officials urge legislators to fix the cap

Last week, two press conferences occurred urging California legislators to take action to fix the cap on school district reserves. The first was held in the Inland Empire on July 7, at the University of Redlands, coinciding with the university's Summer Institute on Leadership for Educational Justice. Representatives from Corona-Norco, Eitwanda, Romoland, Menifee and Alvord school districts all spoke on the issue, with the Fontana Herald News and Highland Community News both running editorials. The second event was held July 9, at the San Francisco Unified School District offices, with members of SFUSD, Berkeley, San Mateo Union High, San Bruno





Park and Redwood City school districts attending and speaking. Media results from the July 9 event included an extensive editorial in the San Francisco Chronicle, as well as coverage in the Contra Costa Times. CDE launches drought response Web page Includes best practices, resources for school districts

To help school districts do their part to conserve water during one of the worst droughts in California's history, the California Department of Education's School Facilities and Transportation Services Division has developed a Drought Response Best Practices and Resources Web page. The page provides outdoor best practices, building/facilities and communication best practices, tips for incorporating water conservation into classroom curriculum and a list of additional resources. Districts may consider these strategies to help them meet the mandatory water use reductions implemented by the State Water Resources Control Board in May. Districts are urged to evaluate strategies based on their climate, existing conditions and any water reduction efforts they have already completed. "Typically, the majority of water use is for irrigation of landscaping and playfields, so a focus on outdoor areas may yield the largest savings," reads a message on the Web page. As centers of the community, schools are in a unique position to lead by example and to educate the public on water conservation. As part of this, districts are invited to participate in the CDE's new Twitter campaign by sharing best practices and using the hashtag #WaterWiseSchools.
