CSBA lends expertise to SPI's education workforce housing initiative



On July 30, CSBA joined State Superintendent of Public Instruction (SPI) Tony Thurmond, school district leaders and University of California researchers at the California Department of Education's headquarters in Sacramento to launch a statewide initiative that aims to increase employee housing on land owned by local educational agencies.

During the event, Andrew Keller, CSBA Senior Director of Executive Office Operations and Strategic Initiatives who oversees the

organization's workforce housing efforts, explained that CSBA has been exploring the use of "surplus school property" since before the pandemic. The directive came from CSBA CEO & Executive Director Vernon M. Billy who was determined to change how state policymakers and school officials view the land and its possible functions.

Some LEAs have considered selling surplus property for short-term financial gains, but Billy has long advocated for preserving assets and so they can benefit communities for years to come.

"As a matter of principle that is the idea behind this approach, it's keeping these assets in the community and finding ways that they can support the long-term financial health of these districts and county offices and ultimately benefit the students they serve by having those teachers stay in the community," Keller said.

With support from the Chan Zuckerberg Initiative and in partnership with UCLA's cityLAB and UC Berkeley's Center for Cities + Schools, [CSBA released a report](#) and a [companion handbook](#) explaining the process of creating education workforce housing. For more than 30 years, CSBA has honored current members of the California Senate and Assembly, as well as members of Congress, who actively work to improve the state's public schools, support local school board governance and exercise leadership in the legislative arena. - Outstanding Legislator (State or Federal)
- Outstanding Freshman Legislator
- Special Recognition
- Albert S. Rodda Lifetime Achievement Award
- Dede Alpert Award for Exemplary Education Leadership

Legal update: Attorney General clarifies remote meeting accommodations for people with disabilities



On July 24, 2024, California Attorney General Rob Bonta issued an opinion clarifying the interplay of the federal Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) with the Brown Act requirement that legislative bodies of local agencies conduct their meetings in person at a location open to the public ([Opinion No. 23-1002](#)). The specific question that prompted the opinion involved whether allowing remote

participation of a member of a legislative body could be a reasonable accommodation in light of the Brown Act requirement that meetings of such bodies be in person and at a location open to the public.

According to the Attorney General, such **remote participation could be a reasonable accommodation where the individual involved has a qualifying disability that precludes their in-person participation**. The Attorney General cautions that even when such accommodation is granted, the **remote participation must be conducted in a manner that simulates in-person attendance, namely, by using two-way live video and audio streaming and disclosing the identity of any adults present in the room with the member**.

County Board Transitional Working Group update



All county board members were recently invited to complete an electronic survey that included questions about priority training topics specific to the county board member role and other relevant topics. **CSBA will use the survey results to help shape the content that will be offered during the CSBA County Board Member Services Conference — formerly known as the CCBE Annual Conference — in Monterey from Sept.**

13-15. Topics will include student mental health and wellness; county boards and county office of education budgets; shared governance; charter authorization, renewals and appeals; community schools; advanced advocacy legislative leadership; setting the superintendent's salary; and getting to know CSBA's governance structure and how to get involved. **The final schedule of workshops will be posted on Aug. 1.
