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

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### Assessing 2023–24 CAASPP scores and achievement gaps



The California Department of Education recently released the results of the 2023–24 California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress. [CDE celebrated these results](#) because some historically disadvantaged student groups saw positive progress that outpaced statewide averages in math and English language arts. While **there was notable improvement in some assessment areas, particularly for Hispanic or Latino and African American students, the statewide improvement rate**

was exceptionally modest, and achievement gaps across student groups remain consistent.

CSBA Principal Research Manager Jeremy Anderson reviewed the data and is sharing his findings in a blog post for members, offering a practical breakdown of average performance by student group, achievement gaps and why more needs to be done to support historically disadvantaged students. ## State update: Deadline to request an ESSER liquidation extension approaches



California local educational agencies interested in applying for a liquidation extension for the third and final round of Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funds have until this Friday, Nov. 1, to do so. Related details and the application form can be found on the California Department of Education's (CDE) [website](#).

Expenditures were required to be obligated by Sept. 30, 2024. The U.S. Department of Education previously issued guidance allowing LEAs to request liquidation extensions for the funds on a project-by-project basis. **Should extensions be granted, individual obligations may be liquidated up to 18 months after the Sept. 30 obligation date.**

### In other state news:

- On Oct. 25, the CDE published [updated School Outdoor Air Quality Activity Recommendations](#). The recommendations aim to help education leaders make informed decisions on potential campus closures and to conduct activities based on air quality conditions when a community is experiencing wildfire smoke.

## Federal update: AI toolkit for education leaders



On Oct. 24, the U.S. Department of Education published the [toolkit](#), “[Empowering Education Leaders: A Toolkit for Safe, Ethical, and Equitable AI Integration](#),” which offers guidance on the use of artificial intelligence (AI) in classrooms. The document has three primary areas of focus: mitigating risk, building strategies for AI integration in the instructional core and maximizing opportunity.

Representatives from multiple California school districts, including Fremont Unified School District, El Segundo USD, Lynwood USD, San Ramon USD and Mountain View-Los Altos Union School District, served as contributing members of the educational leader community on the project. ## In other federal news:

- Final rules that require lead pipes in schools across the country to be replaced within the next decade were recently released by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency with a goal of reducing lead contamination in drinking water. Also announced was \$2.6 billion in new drinking water infrastructure funding through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, which may be used to support the replacement of lead pipes. [Learn more »](#)
