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CSBA rallies school boards and education community against Prop 98 maneuver



CSBA's leadership is rallying against an unconstitutional Prop 98 maneuver that would deprive schools of billions of dollars in future years. The advocacy has attracted significant attention since Gov. Gavin Newsom doubled down on this accounting gimmick in the May Revise. After the Governor's staff revealed the details of his 2024–25 budget proposal, experts from CSBA, Children Now and the education law

firm Dannis Woliver Kelley dissected Gov. Gavin Newsom's May Budget Revision during a May 15 webinar, "May Revise: Prop 98 under siege." The Governor's decision to amplify his Prop 98 maneuver led the discussion. **As explained by CSBA in this *CalMatters* column**, "This maneuver may seem innocuous on its face — or even generous — as it could ease the pain of the 2024–25 budget. Yet, in reality, this sleight of hand would reduce education funding by tens of billions of dollars in the years to come and remove the funding safety net Proposition 98 has provided schools for more than three decades."

Federal update: Resources to support attendance



As part of the **Every Day Counts Summit**, which featured evidence-based approaches to improving school attendance, the Biden Administration announced the **Education Innovation and Research grant program**, making available approximately \$250 million to create, develop, implement and replicate evidence-based solutions that accelerate student achievement, including those designed to reduce chronic absenteeism

and increase student engagement. **New resources and tools** include guidance on how to **use data to identify students who are chronically absent and intervene early**; a **new toolkit** for states and districts to examine **root causes of chronic absenteeism and identify interventions**; a **new resource** for increasing student attendance, engagement and success through career-connected learning; and a **new resource** on addressing transportation needs to improve school attendance. State update: Grant funding available to support student mental health



The purpose of the Mental Health Student Services Act (MHSSA) is to **establish additional mental health partnerships between county mental health or behavioral health departments and local educational agencies to increase access to mental health services in locations that are easily accessible to students and their families**. The goal of this application is to provide services through grants in the following categories: **marginalized and vulnerable youth, universal screening, sustainability** and “other priorities” to allow applicants to identify and address their unique needs. The 70-year anniversary of *Brown v. Board of Education*



Even though the legacy of *Brown v. Board of Education* lives on in many school districts across the country, certain social and legal trends now pose an even greater threat to the **landmark ruling**. On the case's 70th anniversary, it's important not to reflect on California's role in school desegregation and the ongoing educational opportunities it offers to many students. In 1968, Berkeley Unified School District became one of the first large school districts in the country to integrate its elementary schools voluntarily and continues to incorporate innovative methods to encourage diversity in its schools today.
