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Legislative update: Legislature wraps up the two-year 2023–24 legislative session



Ending at midnight on Aug. 31, the State Legislature adjourned the 2023–24 session. Although it adjourned, the Legislature's final day will be Nov. 30, when the current two-year session officially ends.

CSBA's remaining two sponsored bills to help address the administrative burdens many local educational agencies face and to strengthen the process for students to pursue dual enrollment opportunities with local

community colleges passed with wide bipartisan support and are awaiting the Governor's signature. The two CSBA-sponsored bills are:

- **Senate Bill 1244** (Newman, D-Fullerton): This bill would **create a process for school districts to initiate dual enrollment programs with a neighboring community college district** when an agreement cannot be reached with a home community college district, thereby fostering greater flexibility in meeting the educational needs of students statewide. CSBA co-sponsored this legislation with the California High School District Coalition.
- **SB 1315** (Archuleta, D-Pico Rivera): This legislation would **require the California Department of Education to biannually report the total number of reports, scope of reports and costs associated with submitting each report** to the Governor and Legislature. CSBA co-sponsored this legislation with the California Association of School Business Association.

The Governor has until midnight on Sept. 30 to sign or veto legislation. Any measures not officially acted upon by the Governor will automatically become law. CSBA will continue to keep members informed on gubernatorial actions in the coming weeks. In addition to CSBA's sponsored bills, other education measures advanced to the Governor's desk. CSBA releases Education Workforce Housing: Myths and Facts



On Aug. 14, [CSBA led a breakout session on creating education workforce housing \(EWH\) and its relationship to school employee recruitment and retainment](#) at the California Department of Education's Housing Summit. Housing affordability is one of the main barriers to attracting and retaining great teachers and staff across California. During the session, audience members requested a document they could use to

combat myths about EWH.

In response, **CSBA has created "Education Workforce Housing in California: Myths and Facts" to allow local educational agencies to demonstrate the benefits of EWH and dispel myths**, such as "There's no evidence that building education workforce housing improves staff retention and recruitment," (there is) and "Building education workforce housing takes money away from the classroom and employee compensation," (different funding is used). Commission on Teacher Credentialing provides updates on Literacy Performance Assessment



The California Commission on Teacher Credentialing met on Aug. 29-30, with the second day spent in closed session to discuss a pending legal case. Much of the Aug. 29 agenda focused on **progress related to pilot testing and other items associated with the upcoming Literacy Performance Assessment (LPA)**, which will replace the Reading Instruction Competence Assessment (RICA) beginning July 1, 2025, per

Senate Bill 488. Also discussed was the new workgroup established to review all Teaching Performance Assessments (TPAs), as directed by **SB 1263**.

Spring pilot testing for the LPA was successful, with 213 out of 218 scorable candidates passing with an average rate of 97 percent. Waivers were discussed for candidates participating in the next level of field testing, as well as alternative assessments for current teaching program participants. **The LPA will launch on July 1, 2025.
