BROWN ACT AND MEETINGS



WHAT DOES THE BROWN ACT REQUIRE?

- Actions & deliberations taken openly & in public
- Meetings are public, unless closed session is allowed
- Meeting agendas and packets must be available
- Agenda posted on district website







WHAT IS A MEETING?


Majority of the members at the same time and place to hear, discuss or deliberate any item in district's jurisdiction

WHAT IS **NOT** A MEETING?



WHAT IS NOT A MEETING: COVID-19

COVID-19 updates from federal, state or local officials





THREE TYPES OF MEETINGS

- Regular, special and emergency meetings
- Not all discussions about COVID-19 necessarily qualify as an "emergency situation"





MEETING IN COVID-19 ERA



REQUIREMENTS FOR HOLDING A MEETING

No change in purpose

- No change to limits on closed sessions
- > *No change* to notice periods
- > No reduction in agenda requirements



TELEPHONIC MEETINGS: PRE-COVID-19 ERA



- ✓ Location must be open and accessible to the public
- ✓ Agenda shall identify all locations
- Agenda must be posted at all locations
- ✓ Public comment at all locations
- Majority must be within the boundaries
- ✓ All votes by roll call
- ✓ Address potential technical problems



DIALING IT IN... THE COVID-19 ERA



- Location must be open and accessible to the public.
- ✓ Agenda shall identify all locations.
- ✓ Agenda must be posted at all locations.
- ✓ Public comment at all locations.
- ✓ Majority must be within the boundaries.
- ✓ All votes by roll call
- ✓ Address potential technical problems
- Provide ability to "observe and address
 - ... telephonically or otherwise electronically"
- ✓ Provide notice of method(s)
- Indicate procedure for resolving accessibility requests



ELECTRONIC MEETINGS

- Various models:
 - Telephone
 - Videoconference/livestream
- > New challenges:
 - Meeting logistics
 - Record creation
- Hybrid meetings



PUBLIC PARTICIPATION



PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Board meeting <u>IS</u>:

- Meeting of the Board in public to conduct the agency's business
- Board meeting is <u>NOT</u>:
 - A meeting of the public
 - A townhall meeting
 - A press conference





PUBLIC PARTICIPATION OPPORTUNITIES

- Public comment on open and closed session agenda items
- Public comment on items not on the agenda
- Special v. regular meeting public comment rules



PUBLIC COMMENT AND COVID-19





- How does public comment work with virtual board meetings?
- No physical board meeting location required.
- Public must be able to comment "telephonically, or otherwise electronically"
- Agenda Considerations: Provide details



PUBLIC COMMENT OPTIONS: VIRTUAL BOARD MEETINGS

- Emails in advance of the board meeting (read or distribute to the Board)
- Voice mail messages in advance of the board meeting (read or transcribe)
- Live telephonic public comment (Call-in numbers at designated time)
- Live comments if video streaming on Zoom or similar platform
- Use all or the above, any combination, or only one alternative
- Note: Designate a person to read public comments (Use a script/disclaimer)
- Posting public comments: Lawful but not required or advised
- > Tell the public in your agenda how to comment
- First Amendment Considerations
