Dear Assembly Member O'Donnell:

On behalf of the undersigned organizations, we are writing to express our support for Senate Bill 320 (Lara), legislation to strengthen the local pupil fee complaint process, so that it works better for parents and provides guidelines that are clear to schools.

The issue of fees at the local school district level is very important, and our organizations were closely involved in the negotiations in 2012 over AB 1575 and its predecessor, AB 165, which had been vetoed by the Governor in 2011. The final version of AB 1575 that was signed into law represented a delicate balance among the involved parties and the author.

We support the goal laid out in SB 320 because it is important for school districts to charge only those fees that are lawful and to ensure that there is an appropriate remedy for redress. Senator Lara, his staff and the bill's sponsor have worked diligently with us to alleviate concerns we had with the original version of the bill, and the June 30 amendments address nearly all of those concerns. While we continue to believe that the provision requiring a school district that has not appropriately complied with the timelines for a remedy to travel to a State Board of Education meeting is a solution that would be better addressed at the local level, the author's willingness to accept our other proposed amendments allows us to support the bill.

Our organizations remain in full support of ensuring that all districts levy fees appropriately, and support SB 320 as amended. Thank you for your consideration of our views.
